


TOTAL FUNDS RAISED IN THE 2020-2021




Thank you! Our Annual Fund continues to grow thanks to the generosity of our HNMCS Community. To reflect, the 2019-2020 academic year fundraising efforts raised \$149,000, as seen in the 2019-2020 Annual Report. This past year, 2020-2021, raised over \$235,000.


The Annual Fund donations reflect gifts that were made to the Annual Fund campaign, or by supporting the fundraising initiatives like the Tuition Lottery or Christmas Raffle. 2020-2021 also saw the largest single gift made to HNMCS by an anonymous with the value of \$100,000. The graph outlines funds that were directed gifts (outlined in blue, red and yellow graph), along with funds specific to the Annual Fund to support either the **Greatest Needs** (financial aid) or the **Head of School Initiatives** (software licensing, along with professional development). The blue, red, yellow graph illustrates the **directed gifts totalling \$114,363** supporting specific areas of the School; including technology improvements, Middle School improvements as well as covid related expenses. The solid blue graph illustrates total funds raised to support the Annual Fund during the 2020-2021 year, **\$122, 515** in donations raised. In all, over **\$236,00** was raised in the 2020-2021 academic year.



The Annual Fund raised \$122,514.80 during the 2020-2021 year.



These funds were directed to either the **Greatest Needs** programme, helping with financial aid or the **Head of School Initiatives**, which help with professional development and software subscriptions. **Greatest Needs** donations make HNMCS affordable to a wider range of students, bringing your daughter the many benefits of social and economic diversity; while reflecting a founding principle of the Felician Sisters. Did you know that **13**% of our HNMCS Community received some form of financial support during the 2020-2021 year? The average amount of financial aid received by families is approximately \$7,800. Your support towards the **Greatest Needs** helped eliminate financial barriers for families, allowing their daughter(s) to participate in the incredible educational opportunities at HNMCS.



A closer look at the Annual Fund breakdowns down the funds raised for both the **Head of School Initiatives** (\$6,161) as well as **Greatest Needs** (\$116,353) programmes. These funds were raised through a variety of efforts, including the BBQ box sales, Tuition lottery as well as the direct e-campaign that took place in October 2020. Again we thank our Community members who helped make a difference to our 2020-2021 Year.
